PFC SONGWRITER CONTEST 2016 RULES

1. Entry is free for Peninsula Folk Club Members. All other entries incur a \$10 fee 2. The song, both tune and words, must be an original written in the folk genre by the entrant and must have been composed within the last 12 calendar months prior to the Competition date.

3. The songwriter does not have to perform the song written but can nominate another person to perform it on their behalf.

- 4. The person performing the song can use any acoustic instrument to present the song, the only exception is that a electric keyboard is allowed, in piano mode only, with no effects or pre-recorded sound.
- 5. A copy of the song's words plus an audio recording of the song (CD, memory stick or MP 3 file) must be forwarded to: The Secretary, Peninsula Folk Club by 15th of May for acceptance. (See notes below)
- 6. All entrants will be advised if they have or have not made the final which will be on Sunday 5th June. Order of performance will be by ballot.
- 7. The Peninsula Folk Club has the right to refuse any entry on the basis that the content is, in the opinion of the committee, unsuitable.

8. The Judge's decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into..!!. 9. Each shortlisted entrant will need to perform 2 songs on the night of the meeting..the song

they are entering in the competition plus one other song of their choice.

NOTES.

- The audio recording does not have to be of professional quality. A home recording done with a computer and free software such as Audacity should give satisfactory results.
 The recording will be used only in the shortlisting process.

Hi. We would like to have a talk to all of our members about Folk Music, in particular how the Committee makes decisions with regard the "PFC Club Band' that is called on by Councils and Organizations to perform at public events.

The Committee feel that some members are a bit confused as to how the selection of this band is established and how the criteria for being invited works. The key word is "invited" as some people feel that they can just turn up and perform. That is not the case.

Some events are open to all who want to perform. As an example, at the Frankston Mayor's Picnic we have a Marquee where we perform and entertain the public, and all members are welcome, in fact encouraged, to come along and participate. Then there are events, such as the Mornington Festival and Frankston by the Sea Festival, where the Peninsula Folk Club performs on the main stage for the general public. The committee sees the need for a well rehearsed selection of performers, delivering Folk Music that engages the public and also sending a message of what we are about as a club. The PFC Club Band plays a major part in doing this. A reasonably polished performance by a group of people, having fun and inclusive of members who have achieved a level of skill, through hard work, is what we require.

A classic example of a club member who meets the selection criteria is Laurie Cox, who has worked hard on her Bass playing skills and now can adapt and play along

with musicians, not just in a rehearsed performance, but also in a "jamming environment". Laurie contributes to the club in many different ways and puts time into rehearsing with several lineups, including the PFC Club Band.

Another consideration is that the people performing should be selected from members that contribute to your club. Members that attend club concerts, even though they are not performing, members that are



always offering to set up and pull down all of the equipment, members who stay to watch and support other club members - in other words good club members. We are elected by you to make decisions that are in the best interest of the club to ensure that it continues for years to come. This includes the selection of acts for public performances, where the PFC is on show.

If you, as a member, have any concerns about the decisions we make please come and talk to us. That is why we are here.

The crowd at the Bowl was treated to a fifteen minute set by The Seekers, and their seven songs included `Come the Day', `Morningtown Ride', `Red Rubber Ball', `The Carnival Is Over' and `Georgy Girl'. To this day, the concert remains in the record books as the largest concert crowd in the southern hemisphere. March 12, 1967: It's 49 years ago since The Seekers appeared at Melbourne's Myer Music Bowl and set a new attendance record when 200,000 people turned out to see them perform as part of the 'Music For The People' concert.

The Seekers had interrupted filming of their TV special 'The Seekers Down Under' to fly to Melbourne for the event, and on arrival, they were greeted by a motor-


