# At 5.30 PATRICK EVANS of MATON GUITARS WILL RUN A "DROP D" GUITAR WORKSHOP

Drop D tuning, also known as DADGAD..or Celtic tuning is an alternative <u>guitar tuning</u> most associated with Celtic music, though it has also found use in rock, folk, metal and several other genres. Tuning to DADGAD from standard is accomplished by tuning the first, second and sixth strings down a whole step (two frets). The result is an open D suspended fourth chord .Being suspended, the open tuning is neither intrinsically <u>major</u> nor <u>minor</u>.

#### LAST WEAVER PASSES AWAY..RIP Fred Hellerman, 1927-2016

We were saddened to hear of the passing last week of Fred Hellerman, a founding mem-

ber of the Weavers, aged 89. Fred co-founded the seminal folk music quartet in the late 1940s by Hellerman with Pete Seeger, Lee Hays and Ronnie Gilbert. The Weavers were an American folk music quartet based in the Greenwich Village area of New York City. They sang traditional folk songs from around the world, as well as blues, gospel music, children's songs, labor songs, and American ballads, and sold millions of records at the height of their popularity. Their hard-driving string-band style inspired the commercial "folk boom" that followed them in the 1950s

and 1960s, including such performers as <u>The Kingston Trio</u>, <u>Peter, Paul, and Mary</u>, <u>The Rooftop Singers</u>, and <u>Bob Dylan</u>.


