With the minimum of formality you can participate in as much or as little as you like in jam sessions, workshops, there's even going to be an Open Mic.

You will need to be fully vaxed, and self-cater as far as food is concerned (kitchen use is limited) - if cooking is not your thing there are some wonderfull eateries just minutes away.

Shower and toilet facilities are on-site, be aware though that this is a "Bush" camp setting!

Don't forget to take your rubbish home with you!

Come for the weekend, or just come for the day -there's no advance booking required (except for huts), just turn up and pay on arrival.

Fees:

Member - \$50 per adult, or \$20 per child for the weekend \$20 per person for day-trippers.

Non-Member - \$65 per adult, or \$20 per child for the weekend \$35 per person for day-trippers.
