

A TRIBUTE TO OUR EX PRESIDENT. MAX AMOS

Max has passed on after a long series of illnesses that sapped his strength and, in the end, removed much of his quality of life. He was a driving force behind the success of the PFC and the catalyst for so many people to take up playing an instrument, particularly the mandolin. Max was an excellent leader and team player with the vision and experience to add positively to all the organisations that he was involved with during his life. He grew up in Adelaide where he did an electrical apprenticeship and worked in the family business of metal fabrication. Max became involved with car racing and an instructor for the CAMMS racing license, as you must have to drive race car on the track. He

eventually started a photographic business which took him all over Victoria and NSW. He bought a farm in NSW and ran sheep and cattle there. He moved then to Melbourne where he began his collecting of miniature cameras and started as an auctioneer for the Victorian Camera Club. He was a wheeler dealer of the highest order and brought these skills to the PFC and The Fiddlers Convention, making sure that everything ran smoothly, costeffectively and fairly for everyone. He started playing music quite late in life through a chance meeting with me at Harrietville and the PFC Christmas Party. Within a short time, he had begun buying instruments such as guitars, mandolins, fiddle, dobro etc. Max described this as having MAD (Musical in-

strument Acquisition Disorder) - something he blamed me for. He helped set up the Girgarre Moosic Muster and gained sponsorship from Yamaha to provide cheap and free guitars, ukes and fiddles for the use of attendees. Max attended festivals all over the place and brought back ideas for things that the PFC could try. The very successful Hat Band concept came from something he saw at a festival. He started the PFC Mandolin Group for beginners and taught chords and songs to participants. Max and I spoke often about the PFC and he would use me as a sounding board for his ideas. Max was awarded life membership of CAMMS, The Victorian Camera Club and the PFC. He loved a project and was relentless in his pursuit of continuous improvement. The PFC extends our condolences to all of Max's family and friends. Evan Webb
