### Rules and Conditions for Songwriters Competition 2024

1. Entry is free

2. The song, both tune and words, must be an original written in the folk genre by the entrant and must have been composed within the last 12 calendar months prior to the Competition date
3. The songwriter does not have to perform the song written but can nominate another person to perform it on their behalf
4. As this is a Songwriting Contest, performance will be by ONE voice and ONE acoustic instrument. It is permissible to have two people performing the song. Any acoustic instrument can be used to present the song, the only exception is that an electric keyboard is allowed, in piano mode only with no effects or pre-recorded sound
5. (a) Persons intending to enter should contact Barry Larkin on 0418 363 056 or b\_larkin@aapt.net.au to obtain an entry number and to provide name, phone number and email address.

5. (b) A copy of the song's words plus an audio or video recording of the song (MP3 or MP4) must be emailed to Barry Larkin by 12th of May

6. Áll entrants will be advised if they have or have not made the final 10.

7. The Peninsula Folk Club has the right to refuse any entry on the basis that the content is, in the opinion of the committee, unsuitable.

8. The Judge's decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into..!!


