its doors in 2018.

HILLS UKULELE FESTIVAL

It is proudly hosted by Emerald Primary School in the heart of the Dandenong Ranges, Victoria. The Hills Ukulele Festival (or HUF) takes the opportunity every May to welcome the ukulele community up to the hills for breathtaking views, stunning ukulele concerts, inspiring ukulele workshops and that incredi-

ble sense of community that is generated when ukulele players gather in one place.

Previous headline acts have included the Internationally acclaimed artist RIO, The Thin White Ukes, Ryo Montgomery, The Ukulele Death Squad, The Sophisticated Hulas, Duplicity and The Grubby Urchins.

We have also supported up and coming stars like Things That Make You Go MMM to just name a few.

While Emerald Primary School has been on this site for over 125 years, all the school buildings are very new, complete with air purifiers, and are a pleasure in which to get together with others and play the ukulele.

The actual festival came about because the Emerald Primary Music Teacher did such a good job of teaching kids the ukulele that they then wanted to play in a band. They then got so good that they wanted to show off their skills to the world. There wasn't anywhere available, so the music teacher decided to become the Musical Director of The Hills Ukulele Festival.

WE NOTE THE PASSING OF TWO FOLK MUSIC ICONS

Roger Whittaker,

one of the UK's most celebrated folk singers, has died aged 87. **Roger Henry Brough Whittaker** (22 March 1936 - 13 September 2023) was a Kenyan-born British singer-songwriter and musician. ^[3] His music is an eclectic mixture of <u>folk music</u> and popular songs, the latter variously in a <u>crooning</u> or in a <u>schlager</u> style. He is best known for his baritone singing voice and trademark <u>whistling</u> ability as well as his guitar skills. Whittaker was best known for hits including "Durham Town", "New World In The Morning" and a version of "Wind Beneath My Wings".

Peter Yarrow

of the folk trio Peter, Paul and Mary has died at the age of 86. The singer died on Tuesday (January 7) at his home on the <u>Upper West</u>

his home on the <u>Upper West</u> <u>Side</u> of Manhattan. Yarrow's death was confirmed by his publicist, Ken Sunshine, who shared that Yarrow died from <u>bladder cancer</u>, which he had been battling for the past four years.

The tenor was known for bringing his gentle vocals to the group, which became one of the most popular folk acts of the Sixties. Formed in 1961 by Yarrow, Noel
